## Jacky Adams Receives David Archie Award

Kelly Robertson, editor of *The Iowan* magazine, presented the David E. Archie award to IHPA board member Jacky Adams at a special ceremony on November 1, at the Temple for the Performing Arts in Des Moines.

Jacky was chosen for her long-time work on a variety of historic preservation projects in the Red Oak area. She and her husband, have aided in the restoration of several houses and the Red Oak depot. Her current project is the adaptive reuse of the old Murphy calendar factory.

IHPA President Tom Smull served as Master of Ceremonies. Guest speaker at the event was Anita Walker, Director of the Department of Cultural Affairs.

Pioneer Communications, publisher of *The Iowan* established the award to honor David E. Archie who was the founder and publisher of *The Iowan* magazine for most of its fifty year history. He was an active preservation supporter.

*The Iowan* donated \$500 to the IHPA in Jacky's honor. She is only the fourth recipient of the award.

## Nominations Sought for Preservation at Its Best Awards

Nominations are being sought for IHPA's annual Preservation at Its Best Awards.

A panel of judges, familiar with preservation projects, will select a winner in each of the categories: large commercial, small commercial, public, large residential, small residential, rural and archeological. The awards will be presented at the annual awards ceremonies held in Des Moines in May as part of Historic Preservation Week.

The IHPA has been sponsoring the awards since 1996. Each winner receives a certificate and a plaque honoring the project.

Deadline for receiving nominations is March 15, 2004. Any individual or organization may submit nominations.

## Two Iowa Groups Receive National Trust Grants

Two Iowa properties received grants from the National Trust's Johanna Favrot Fund.

The Hardin County Historic Preservation Commission of Iowa Falls was awarded \$10,000 to complete a county-wide Archaeology and Paleontology Resources Management Plan and Education Program. The project will help to ensure preservation of the Native American cultural resources in the Iowa River Greenbelt.

Residents for Responsible Renovation (3R's) of Decorah was awarded \$3,250 to produce a video and brochure that will present the story and advocate the continued use of the historic Decorah East Side and Middle School complex as a school facility.

## **President's Message**

### **New Resolution Creates Local IHPA Chapters**

Preservation, like politics, is mostly local. Now your IHPA Board of Directors is creating a structure to help local communities tap the grassroots power of preservation as part of the IHPA structure. At its October 22 meeting, the IHPA Board passed a resolution creating local chapters that have missions and bylaws in accordance with those of the IHPA. In addition, local chapter members must be IHPA members and must elect a representative to the IHPA Board. In return, local chapters would be able to utilize the IHPA non-profit status for grant applications and enjoy closer partnership with the statewide organization.

There are other details involved, but the idea is that IHPA can increase its influence through local chapters and vice versa. The first chapter will in all likelihood be the Council Bluffs Preservation Alliance. CBPA president, Debra Danielson, already is an active member of the IHPA board was a driving force behind the new expanded structure. With a few hurdles to be crossed, the CBPA could be an official local chapter by the time you read this.

## Country School Grants

Thanks to lobbying efforts by the Iowa Cultural Coalition and the IHPA, funding has been restored for several historic preservation programs, including the Country School Grant program.

The state may provide grants up to \$5,000 in matching funds for the preservation of buildings at least fifty years old that were used as one-or two-room schools. The restored country schools must be used for educational purposes.

## Recent National Register Additions

### LINN COUNTY

PUCKER STREET HISTORIC DISTRICT, BOUNDED BY 13<sup>TH</sup> STREET, 9<sup>TH</sup> AVENUE, 20<sup>TH</sup> STREET, AND SOUTH SIDE OF 8<sup>TH</sup> AVENUE, MARION



This historic district is significant for its association with, and representation of, the historical development of an important residential neighborhood in the City of Marion. This neighborhood was the home for the city's wealthy and influential.

GLENN O. AND LUCY O. PYLE HOUSE, 1540 8<sup>TH</sup> AVENUE, MARION



The Pyle House is a good representation of the stylish homes that were added along 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue to the Pucker Street Historic District in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. This home and its history reflect the later years of the social and architectural evolution of this neighborhood, which was populated by Marion's wealthy and influential citizens in the late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> centuries.

### LUCAS COUNTY

FIRST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH, 923 ROLAND, CHARITON



The First United Methodist Church, built in 1900, is locally significant under Criterion C as a fine, unaltered example of turn of the century Gothic Revival. It was designed by well known Illinois architect, Samuel A. Bullard.

### MARSHALL COUNTY

MARSHALLTOWN DOWNTOWN HISTORIC DISTRICT, 200 BLOCK E. MAIN TO 100 BLOCK W. MAIN, SIDE STREETS, MARSHALLTOWN

Under Criterion A, the Marshalltown Downtown Historic District derives significance under the categories "Commerce," "Politics / Government," and "Transportation."

Under Criterion C, the District is significant under the theme "Architecture" as a representative collection of the commercial architectural styles and vernacular building forms that appeared in Marshalltown from the 1860s through the 1940s.

STATE CENTER COMMERCIAL HISTORIC DISTRICT, MAIN STREET BLOCKS 200-100 WEST AND 100 EAST, STATE CENTER



The historical significance of the district lies in its representation of the central business district from the late 1860s to the present and its reflection of the many varied enterprises that evolved in the late 19<sup>th</sup> to early 20<sup>th</sup> centuries within this community. The architectural significance lies in the retention and integrity of many of the historic buildings constructed between the 1860s and 1952.

### MITCHELL COUNTY



OSAGE COMMERCIAL HISTORIC DISTRICT, MAIN STREET BLOCKS 700, 600 AND PARTS OF 500 BLOCKS, OSAGE

The historical significance of the Osage Commercial district lies in its representation of the central business district from the 1860s to the present and its reflection of the varied commercial, public, social, cultural, and recreation al enterprises that evolved in the late 19<sup>th</sup> to early 20<sup>th</sup> centuries within this community.

WALNUT GROVE SCHOOL, 3272 FOOTHILL AVENUE, OSAGE



The Walnut Grove School, built in 1873, is significant as the only remaining structurally sound, unaltered, one-room rural school on its original site, in Mitchell County

### MONTGOMERY COUNTY

GRANT COMMERCIAL HISTORIC DISTRICT, PARTS OF SECOND STREET AND U AVENUE, GRANT



The historical significance of this district lies in its representation of a small town business district from the 1870s to the 1950s and its reflection of the slow but persistent growth of this southwestern Iowa town. The architectural significance of the district lies in the retention of an unusual collection of early frame commercial buildings and the addition of a series of small brick, primarily automobile-related, buildings in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century.
